On March 20, 2013, the company sold its 50.001% interest in Powell River Energy Inc (PREI) for proceeds of \$33.0 million. Up to the date of sale, we consolidated 100% of PREI's balances in our consolidated results as Powell River Energy was a variable interest entity in which the company was the primary beneficiary.
